Romans 6:23 "the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord"

(2) God and war in the Bible

God's war – his people's need to obey

The war in Joshua was God's Holy War – he can't be "enlisted"

The invasion was to fulfil God's promise

God is teaching obedience to his commands

God's gradual education of his people

War a feature of life in Ancient Near East

God's education of the Israelites...

...and his abandonment of earthly war in the New Testament

- Luke 6:35 "love your enemies, do good to them, and lend to them without expecting to get anything back"
- Matthew 5:9 "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called sons of God."
- Jeremiah 31:33 "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people."
